### CALL FOR PROPOSALS

We are gearing up for the next WF CHRIE Regional Conference! The conference is sponsored by California State University, East Bay and will be held at the Lodge at Sonoma Renaissance Resort and Spa in Sonoma, California.

#### **CALL FOR PROPOSALS**

1. **Proposals are due by 5pm (Pacific), September 21st, 2018.** Acceptance notices will be sent by October 21, 2018, PT. All proposals will be double blind reviewed.
2. Each proposal must be in one of two tracks: 1) Education/Teaching/Pedagogy; or 2) Applied Research. **A best proposal award (with \$250 prize) is given for each track.**
3. All proposals are submitted through Easy Chair at the following link: <https://easychair.org/conferences/?conf=wfchrie2019>. Please select a track when you submit the title page and proposal in Word format (.doc or .docx).
4. There are 4 types of submissions. Please specify which type of your submission is when submitting to Easy Chair:
  - (1) 20-minute stand-up presentation;
  - (2) 10 minute stand-up "speed" presentation;
  - (3) 50-minute panel/round-table discussion/workshop/symposium; or
  - (4) Poster presentation.

The stand-up presentations (10- or 20-minutes) are focused on empirical research. The "speed" presentations focus on research in progress or summaries of research and allow more time for discussion and feedback.

The 50-minute panel/discussion/workshops should focus on a particular problem, challenge, or idea (in pedagogy or empirical research) and should not be used to present original research.

5. Each submission should include two documents:
  - (1) Title page: The title, author names and affiliation;
  - (2) Main Document

The main document should meet these criteria:

- No more than 4 pages, including title, abstract (up to 75 words), and main body
- Main body must be between 500 and 900 words), including figures, tables, and references
- Use 12 point, Times New Roman font, and single-spaced.
- Margins should be 1-inch on sides, 1-inch on top and bottom.

Any submission not following the guidelines is subject to desk rejection. **Please use the submission template in the Appendix to prepare your submission.**

6. Participants are limited to a maximum of 2 single-presenter proposals, or 3 total proposals if they are also participating in a panel presentation/workshop/etc.
7. Presentation rooms will include a screen with projector or monitor and computer, so working from a thumb drive is possible. Presenters may use the host laptop or bring their own (*bring appropriate converter for HDMI/VGA output*).
8. This conference is open to original work, work in progress and work presented at other conferences or previously published. However, work that has been submitted or presented elsewhere will not be published in the conference proceedings.
9. Conference Proceedings will be published following the conference. Authors wishing to publish in the conference proceedings will be given the opportunity to revise their submission based on reviewer comments. A second round of reviews will be conducted prior to acceptance in the conference proceedings. Only original, unpublished works will be eligible for publication in the proceedings.
10. At least one author must register for the conference and present at the conference.

## **APPENDIX: SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

Note: Poster sessions, topical seminars and in-progress works are reviewed similarly to completed empirical works. Although all proposals follow a format typical to empirical work, authors may indicate their level of completion to date and strengthen the rigor of their topical seminar or poster by enhancing their proposal with traditional formatting as follows:

TITLE PAGE  
**(on a single page, separate from Main Document)**

TITLE OF THE PROPOSAL (RIGHT ALIGNED)

MAIN DOCUMENT  
**(separate from title page)**

TITLE OF THE PROPOSAL: (LEFT ALIGNED)

ABSTRACT (LEFT ALIGNED with Indentation on a page by itself)

Abstract up to 75 words – that describes your proposal. Indent the first sentences of each paragraph. If multiple paragraphs are used, single space between and within each paragraph. Do not number the pages. The pages are numbered by the editor in the conference proceedings. The title page is on its OWN page, separate from the main document (including abstract, main body of the proposal, references, figures and tables).

The four-page limit refers to the main document, not the title page.

*For topical seminars, the abstract should indicate how session participants are engaged and key outcomes of the seminar.*

Key Words: (left aligned, no Indentation) Include a list of no more than 6 keywords.

INTRODUCTION (left aligned, no Indentation)

The main document should be no more than 4 pages, including title, abstract, main body of the proposal (with a minimum of 500 words and not exceeding 900 words), figures, tables, and references. Describe your work in 12-point, Times New Roman font, and single-spaced. Margins should be 1-inch on sides, 1-inch on top and bottom.

TABLES AND FIGURES (if appropriate to session type)

Tables and figures must appear within the text (not at the end of the text). Tables and figures should be numbered sequentially (e.g. Table 1, Table 2, Table 3, etc.), and should bear titles which explain their content.

REFERENCES

References must be listed immediately following the main text of the proposal. Use APA style, alphabetize by author. See examples below:

Calfee, R. C., & Valencia, R. R. (1991). *APA guide to preparing manuscripts for journal publication*. Washington, DC: American Psychological Association.

Davis, F. (1989). Perceived usefulness, perceived ease of use, and user acceptance of information technology. *MIS Quarterly*, 13 (3), 319-340.

Henry, W. A., III. (1990, April 9). Making the grade in today's schools. *Time*, 135, 28-31.
